THE PERAMBULATION OF THE TOWN BOUNDARY

ON

BANK HOLIDAY MONDAY, 26 MAY 2014

The Ceremonies, which are associated with Rogationtide, ie the blessing of the land, its fruits, industry and leisure, as well as demarcating the boundary of the town, will commence at 9.30 am

A procession will form up of all those participating outside the Town Hall, headed by the Town Band and led by the Town Mayor, Councillor Ian Davies, and members of Beaumaris Town Council, to proceed to divine Service.

After which, the Town Mayor and members of Beaumaris Town Council will proceed to the Pierhead, when a pebble will be cast into the Menai Strait as a reminder of the jurisdiction of the town of Beaumaris and its former Corporation over the harbour and its waters.

The Perambulation of the Boundary, led by Mr Will Williams, will then commence from the landward side of the Pier, moving along the shore in the direction of Gallows Point.

for the Ceremony of Crowning the oldest lady inhabitant of that area, Mrs Sal Casey, with a crown of heather and flowers by the Town Mayoress. A collection for the 'Queen' will be carried out.

3.00 pm (approx) Service at Llaniestyn Church
